

NEW FAMILIES

He will get back to you to arrange a convenient time to meet with him to register. We are eager to greet new members of our parish community and look forward to meeting you.

RECTORY OFFICE HOURS

The rectory office hours are Monday through Friday from 9:00am to noon and 1:00pm to 5:00pm. During the summer the rectory will close at 3:00pm on Fridays. Items for the Sunday newsletter must be at the rectory by Monday at noon for publication the following Sunday.

BAPTISMS

Baptisms are held at 12 noon on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of the month. Parents must attend a Pre-Jordan class held in the Wright Center at 12 noon on the first Sunday of every other month (please refer to the bulletin for exact dates). Registration for the class is required. In order to arrange for a baptism, the parents must be active members of the parish for six months. To register, please call the rectory office at 610/789-7676. Godparents should be practicing Catholics, confirmed and at least 16 years of age. If not from this parish, sponsors must have a letter of eligibility from their parish stating that they have been actively participating for six months. St. Bernadette Parishioners must be registered and actively participating for six months to receive a letter of eligibility.

MARRIAGES

We request that couples contemplating marriage call the rectory to make an appointment with the priest. At this initial interview, the date and time of your request will be recorded and you will receive a copy of the Parish Wedding Guidelines.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK/COMMUNION CALLS

A priest will administer Holy Communion to parishioners who are unable to come to Church. If you desire, Eucharistic Ministers can bring Communion each week. Please contact the Rectory to be placed on our Sick List. Parishioners who are to undergo serious surgery at a hospital are encouraged to make an appointment at the Rectory before going to the hospital.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

St. Bernadette School offers sessions for Pre-School and Kindergarten and conducts full-time classes from first through eighth grades. ASH WEDNESDAY - FEBRUARY 14

Ashes will be distributed *within* the Mass at 8:30am, 12:15pm and 7:00pm. Ashes will also be distributed at a prayer service at 4:00pm.

FAST AND ABSTINENCE AND OTHER ACTS OF PENANCE FOR LENT

The Bishops of the United States prescribe, as minimal obligation, that all persons who are fourteen years of age and older are bound to abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday, February 14, on all the Fridays of Lent and Good Friday. Further, all persons eighteen years of age and older, up to and including their fifty-ninth birthday, are bound to fast by limiting themselves to a single full meal on Ash Wednesday and on Good Friday, while the other two meals on those days are to be light.

All the faithful are encouraged, when possible, to participate at Mass and to receive the Holy Eucharist daily, to celebrate frequently the Sacrament of Penance, to undertake spiritual reading, especially the study of the Sacred Scriptures, and to participate in parish Lenten devotions as well as Lenten education programs. Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament is especially recommended.

All are encouraged to participate in Operation Rice Bowl-the collection will be taken up on Palm Sunday, March 24.

THE PASTOR'S COLUMN

PRAISE THE LORD, WHO HEALS THE BROKENHEARTED

In today's Readings we hear of Job lamenting his struggles: "I have been assigned months of misery, and troubled nights have been allotted to me" and "I shall not see happiness again." We also hear about Jesus curing the sick and casting out demons and the crowd that was gathering. It would probably have been a lot easier for him stay there but he moves on to the other villages. Jesus was always careful to not get caught in the crowds. Although he does minister to crowds and feeds the multitude, often times we hear of him slipping away. So often when we follow Christ we can get up in the crowd and become busy with things about Jesus, the spectacle, the reputation, the outward appearance. However Jesus never loses sight of his mission. His mission is to let the people of God know the Good News, that the Messiah has come, the fulfilment of the Law and the Prophets is here. That is our mission too! We share in Christ's Mission. St. Paul says in the second reading: "If I preach the gospel, this is no reason for me to boast, for an obligation has been imposed on me, and woe to me if I do not preach it!"

We have the responsibility to make the Love of the Father present in the world around us, present in our families, present in our communities, present in our schools, our work places. This includes those times when we feel like we have been assigned months of misery and troubled nights, or we think we shall never see happiness again, or our family is sick. We are called to be the light in the darkness, the hope in despair, the compassion in suffering. Saying yes to following Christ means leaving the comfort of the crowd, turning away from the ways of the world and toward Christ, walking with him, and sharing in His mission.
