# **NEW FAMILIES**

Welcome to St. Bernadette Parish! To register in the parish, please email Deacon Tom Fitzpatrick at <u>deacontom@stbl.org</u>. He will get back to you to arrange a convenient time to meet with him to register. We are eager to greet new members of our parish community and look forward to meeting you.

#### **RECTORY OFFICE HOURS**

The rectory office hours are Monday through Friday from 9:00am to noon and 1:00pm to 5:00pm. **During the summer the rectory will close at 3:00pm on Fridays.** Items for the Sunday newsletter must be at the rectory by Monday at noon for publication the following Sunday.

#### **BAPTISMS**

Baptisms are held at 12 noon on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of the month. Parents must attend a Pre-Jordan class held in the Wright Center at 12 noon on the first Sunday of every other month (please refer to the bulletin for exact dates). Registration for the class is required. In order to arrange for a baptism, the parents must be active members of the parish for six months. To register, please call the rectory office at 610/789-7676. Godparents should be practicing Catholics, confirmed and at least 16 years of age. If not from this parish, sponsors must have a letter of eligibility from their parish stating that they have been actively participating for six months. St. Bernadette Parishioners must be registered and actively participating for six months to receive a letter of eligibility.

#### **MARRIAGES**

We request that couples contemplating marriage call the rectory to make an appointment with the priest. At this initial interview, the date and time of your request will be recorded and you will receive a copy of the Parish Wedding Guidelines.

## **SACRAMENT OF THE SICK/COMMUNION CALLS**

A priest will administer Holy Communion to parishioners who are unable to come to Church. If you desire, Eucharistic Ministers can bring Communion each week. Please contact the Rectory to be placed on our Sick List. Parishioners who are to undergo serious surgery at a hospital are encouraged to make an appointment at the Rectory before going to the hospital.

## RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

# THE PASTOR'S COLUMN

We Welcome Bishop McIntyre to St. Bernadette of Lourdes Parish for the celebration of our 9:00 Mass. We are honored to have a Successor of the Apostles and a representative of Archbishop Nelson Perez here to lead us in prayer and worship in this Lenten Season. Thank you, Bishop McIntyre, for being here today and for all you do for the people of the Archdiocese of Philadelphia.

# "THIS IS MY BELOVED SON. LISTEN TO HIM."

In today's Gospel reading we hear the story of the Transfiguration of Jesus. In this story Jesus starts out by doing something very common for him to do. He took a step back from the crowds and even his disciples with the purpose of having time alone with God the Father. This time he brought along his inner circle, Peter, James, and John. It is while going about this ordinary routine that something extraordinary happened. Jesus was transfigured, transformed into something more beautiful and elevated, so much so that even his clothes became a dazzling white. And then to add to the scene, Moses and Elijah appear and start conversing with him. Then, even more miraculous, a cloud came, casting a shadow over them; from the cloud came a voice, "This is my beloved Son, Listen to him."

For many this is a definitive sign of the Divinity of Jesus Christ. The apostles got a glimpse of Jesus in all his glory, his true identity as the Beloved Son of God to whom the whole Law and Prophets point. For what was to come they needed that glimpse, to see the mighty power of God in Jesus. I am sure that they relied on that moment many times throughout Jesus' passion, and in the difficult early years of the Church. We too are reminded of Jesus's identity in the beginning of this season of Penance. We are reminded of the Glory of Jesus Christ. Then we are reminded of how he humbled himself and endured suffering and death for us. He did not need to, but freely chose to out of Love for us.

As this account of the Transfiguration reminds us of Jesus' identity, we are also called to remember our own identity in Christ. And knowing who we are, we embrace in humility our own penances. Through acts of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving we die to self and rise with Christ. In performing our ordinary acts of humble penance God can turn them into extraordinary avenues of grace in our lives.
