#### **RECTORY OFFICE HOURS**

The rectory office hours are Monday through Friday from 9:00am to noon and 1:00pm to 5:00pm. During the summer the rectory will close at 3:00pm on Fridays. Items for the Sunday newsletter must be at the rectory by Monday at noon for publication the following Sunday.

#### BAPTISMS

Baptisms are held at 12 noon on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of the month. Parents must attend a Pre-Jordan class held in the Wright Center at 12 noon on the first Sunday of every other month. Registration for the class is required. In order to arrange for a baptism, the parents must be active members of the parish. To register, please call the rectory office at 610/789-7676 ext. 101. Godparents should be practicing Catholics, confirmed and at least 16 years of age. If not from this parish, sponsors must have a letter of eligibility from their parish stating that they have been actively participating. St. Bernadette Parishioners must be registered and actively participating.

#### MARRIAGES

We request that couples contemplating marriage call the rectory to make an appointment with the priest. At this initial interview, the date and time of your request will be recorded and you will receive a copy of the Parish Wedding Guidelines.

#### SACRAMENT OF THE SICK/COMMUNION CALLS

A priest will administer Holy Communion to parishioners who are unable to come to Church. If you desire, Eucharistic Ministers can bring Communion each week. Please contact the Rectory to be placed on our Sick List. Parishioners who are to undergo serious surgery at a hospital are encouraged to make an appointment at the Rectory before going to the hospital.

### Art Class at St. Bernadette School

In art class, students from Pre-K 4 through 8th grade explore creativity through the elements of art (line, shape, color, value, space, form, and texture) and design principles (balance, contrast, movement, rhythm, unity, emphasis, and pattern). They explore the history of art, studying various artists from different eras. During Black History Month, the focus is on African American artists like Alma Thomas, Faith Ringgold, Jean-Michel Basquiat, and Kehinde Wiley. Students learn about these artists' lives and works, then create their own art inspired by them. # THE PASTOR'S COLUMN

# BECAUSE OF THE GREAT LOVE HE HAD FOR US, EVEN WHEN WE WERE DEAD IN OUR TRANSGRESSIONS, BROUGHT US TO LIFE WITH CHRIST.

Now that we are in this fourth week of Lent I can see how much I am in need of a Savior. In this time of zealous spiritual practices, self-examination, and focusing on the basics I still find myself struggling and tending to fall back into bad habits. That's why the readings this weekend give me such great Hope, the sure and confident expectation of receiving what God has promised us in the future.

Today's readings give me so much Hope because they explain that it does not all depend on me. My salvation does not depend upon me getting it right all the time. That gives me hope because I have failed in my own personal Lenten sacrifice several times and even forgot it was Friday and ate a bacon cheese burger before I remembered later in the day.

The Israelites in the first reading where suffering in Exile but God brought them out of it and back into the Promised Land. In the Gospel, Jesus teaches us that God loved us so much that he sent His only Son so that we might have the fullness of life. He did not come to condemn the world but to save it. God desires for us to be saved and it is through his grace that we are saved. So when I continue to stumble and fall, forget or make poor choices I know all is not lost and there is no reason to despair or lose hope. Jesus Christ is the savior, through his suffering, death and resurrection we are saved. Our faith reminds us to get back up, refocus, and repent again and again to unite our hearts, minds, and actions to Jesus Christ the one through whom we have salvation.

## CATHOLIC CHARITIES APPEAL.ORG - GIVING HOPE TO ALL

"My parents brought me to Church every Sunday when I was growing up; my mom would interpret the Mass for me in American Sign Language (ASL). I knew as a kid that I could be a Deacon and give back to the Church and the Deaf community. I have met several Deaf men who showed interest in becoming a Deacon, but they did not have the support of their dioceses. Fortunately, with the support of the Deaf Apostolate Office, I was able to discern my calling to become an ordained Deacon for the Archdiocese of Philadelphia.

The Deaf Apostolate provides pastoral care, sacramental preparation, religious education, and a regular schedule of Masses in ASL with the Catholic community who are Deaf or hard of hearing. Learning about your faith and not understanding what is being said is a challenge. Mass in ASL makes our faith visible in our own language — it gives our community access. We can process information more clearly when it's in our language. When you support the Catholic Charities Appeal, your donations help the Deaf community access their faith and participate in the Church".
