RECTORY OFFICE HOURS

The rectory office hours are Monday through Friday from 9:00am to noon and 1:00pm to 5:00pm. **During the summer the rectory will close at 3:00pm on Fridays.** Items for the Sunday newsletter must be at the rectory by Monday at noon for publication the following Sunday.

BAPTISMS

Baptisms are held at 12 noon on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of the month. Parents must attend a Pre-Jordan class held in the Wright Center at 12 noon on the first Sunday of every other month. Registration for the class is required. In order to arrange for a baptism, the parents must be active members of the parish. To register, please call the rectory office at 610/789-7676 ext. 101. Godparents should be practicing Catholics, confirmed and at least 16 years of age. If not from this parish, sponsors must have a letter of eligibility from their parish stating that they have been actively participating. St. Bernadette Parishioners must be registered and actively participating.

MARRIAGES

We request that couples contemplating marriage call the rectory to make an appointment with the priest. At this initial interview, the date and time of your request will be recorded and you will receive a copy of the Parish Wedding Guidelines.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK/COMMUNION CALLS

A priest will administer Holy Communion to parishioners who are unable to come to Church. If you desire, Eucharistic Ministers can bring Communion each week. Please contact the Rectory to be placed on our Sick List. Parishioners who are to undergo serious surgery at a hospital are encouraged to make an appointment at the Rectory before going to the hospital.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

St. Bernadette School offers sessions for Pre-School and Kindergarten and conducts full-time classes from first through eighth grades. THE PASTOR'S COLUMN

And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit

Today in the Church we celebrate the Solemnity of Pentecost, the remembrance and celebration of the Holy Spirit's descent upon the Apostles and Mary. The Spirit's mission to us is to bring our unredeemed humanity into the life of God. He is the one who gives us life, the one who brings us into interactions with God. Through our Baptism and especially our Confirmation, the Holy Spirit is present within us. He is the re-creating, rejuvenating gift of God's presence within. We are temples of the Holy Spirit, the same Spirit that created the world in the first place and gave us God's life within us.

This life is within each of us as individuals and as the Church. If we look at the Apostles we readily see how different they were. Jesus did not change them; he did not make them into a set of pre-packaged models. He left their differences and now he unites them by anointing them with the Holy Spirit. With the anointing comes their union — union in diversity. At Pentecost, the Apostles understand the unifying power of the Spirit. They see it with their own eyes when everyone, though speaking in different languages, comes together as one people: the people of God, shaped by the Spirit, who weaves unity from diversity and bestows harmony because in the Spirit there is harmony. He himself is harmony. (Pope Francis, Pentecost 2020) This is part of the fulfillment of Jesus's Desire: that we may be One.

Don't get me wrong, I am not trying to make a political statement about Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion. Diversity for the sake of diversity is ridiculous. However, diversity for the sake of sharing gifts and talents, stories and backgrounds, experiences and knowledge for the building up of the body of Christ on Earth is a beautiful thing. And when we allow ourselves to be drawn out of ourselves and into community we see God working in miraculous ways even if it is not accompanied by great gusts of winds, people speaking different languages, or tongues of fire.



This week we received the sad news of Mrs. Montie's decision to retire as Principal of St. Bernadette of Lourdes Parish School. Mrs. Montie has worked tirelessly in our school as a teacher and a principle and it will be hard to imagine our school community without her. She taught many lessons but the most important lesson she taught countless students throughout the years is about the love of Jesus and Mary and how to be the hands and feet of Jesus in the world. We thank her for her years of dedicated service and love she has given to our community and wish her well in her new journey.
