NEW FAMILIES

RECTORY OFFICE HOURS

The rectory office hours are Monday through Friday from 9:00am to noon and 1:00pm to 5:00pm. During the summer the rectory will close at 3:00pm on Fridays. Items for the Sunday newsletter must be at the rectory by Monday at noon for publication the following Sunday.

BAPTISMS

Baptisms are held at 12 noon on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of the month. Parents must attend a Pre-Jordan class held in the Wright Center at 12 noon on the first Sunday of every other month. Registration for the class is required. In order to arrange for a baptism, the parents must be active members of the parish. To register, please call the rectory office at 610/789-7676 ext. 101. Godparents should be practicing Catholics, confirmed and at least 16 years of age. If not from this parish, sponsors must have a letter of eligibility from their parish stating that they have been actively participating. St. Bernadette Parishioners must be registered and actively participating.

MARRIAGES

We request that couples contemplating marriage call the rectory to make an appointment with the priest. At this initial interview, the date and time of your request will be recorded and you will receive a copy of the Parish Wedding Guidelines.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK/COMMUNION CALLS

A priest will administer Holy Communion to parishioners who are unable to come to Church. If you desire, Eucharistic Ministers can bring Communion each week. Please contact the Rectory to be placed on our Sick List. Parishioners who are to undergo serious surgery at a hospital are encouraged to make an appointment at the Rectory before going to the hospital.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

St. Bernadette School offers sessions for Pre-School and Kindergarten and conducts full-time classes from first through eighth grades. 

THE PASTOR'S COLUMN

"THIS IS MY BLOOD OF THE COVENANT, WHICH WILL BE SHED FOR MANY."

This Sunday we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Lord Jesus Christ, traditionally known as Corpus Christi. This celebration emphasizes the joy of the Eucharist being the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ. This is considered one of those hard sayings or hard teachings that most Christians reject. Even people in the Gospel turned away from Jesus after this teaching in what we call the Bead of Life Discourse in John's Gospel. Jesus is leading his listeners from the Old Covenant to the New Covenant. In the Old Covenant, the supreme dwelling place of God on earth was in the temple in Jerusalem, but in the New Covenant God is with us in Jesus anytime we celebrate the Eucharist and Jesus gives himself to us in the bread and wine changed into his Body and Blood during Mass. In the Old Covenant, God fed his people with manna when they were wandering in the desert as we heard in our first reading, but in the New Covenant Jesus feeds us with his own Body and Blood through his Real Presence in the Eucharist.

The secondary focus of this solemnity is on the Body of Christ as it is present in the Church. The Church is called the Body of Christ because of the intimate communion which Jesus shares with his disciples. Christ expressed this unity by using the metaphor of a body, in which He is the head. This image helps to keep in focus both the unity and the diversity of the Church. So, during any Eucharistic celebration, Christ makes himself available, draws us closer to himself, and unites us with one another.



We are happy to welcome Seminarian Dominic Mirenda. Dominic will be living and working here at St. Bernadette's for the summer and then on Thursdays throughout the school year. This is part of the Seminary Formation to learn the ins and outs of parish life, gain experience interacting and working with parishioners, and participate in parish life. Please do your best to welcome Dominic and keep him in your prayers.

D-DAY June 6, 1944 "As our boat touched sand and the ramp went down I became a visitor to hell."

D-Day: It is hard to conceive the epic scope of this decisive battle that foreshadowed the end of Hitler's dream of Nazi domination. Overlord was the largest air, land and sea operation undertaken before or since June 6, 1944. The landing included over 5,000 ships, 11,000 airplanes and over 150,000 service men.

After years of meticulous planning and seemingly endless training for the Allied Forces, it all came down to this: The boat ramp goes down, then jump, swim, run and crawl to the cliffs. Many of the first young men (most not yet 20 years old) entered the surf carrying eighty pounds of equipment. They faced over 200 yards of beach before reaching the first natural feature offering any protection. Blanketed by small-arms fire and bracketed by artillery, they found themselves in hell.

When it was over, the Allied Forces had suffered nearly 10,000 casualties; more than 4,000 were dead. Yet somehow, due to planning and preparation, and due to the valor, fidelity and sacrifice of the Allied Forces, Fortress Europe had been breached.

For just a moment... Think of everything you did today the breakfast you ate, the car you drove to work, the money you made and the TV you watch. Everything you know would not be, if not for those brave guys who made that endeavor for you that day on those French beaches and in those hedgerows, many making the ultimate sacrifice...trading their lives for a single ambition...so we could live free.
