BAPTISMS

Baptisms are held at 12 noon on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of the month. Parents must attend a Pre-Jordan class held in the Wright Center at 12 noon on the first Sunday of every other month. Registration for the class is required. In order to arrange for a baptism, the parents must be active members of the parish. To register, please call the rectory office at 610/789-7676 ext. 101. Godparents should be practicing Catholics, confirmed and at least 16 years of age. If not from this parish, sponsors must have a letter of eligibility from their parish stating that they have been actively participating. St. Bernadette Parishioners must be registered and actively participating.

MARRIAGES

We request that couples contemplating marriage call the rectory to make an appointment with the priest. At this initial interview, the date and time of your request will be recorded and you will receive a copy of the Parish Wedding Guidelines.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK/COMMUNION CALLS

A priest will administer Holy Communion to parishioners who are unable to come to Church. If you desire, Eucharistic Ministers can bring Communion each week. Please contact the Rectory to be placed on our Sick List. Parishioners who are to undergo serious surgery at a hospital are encouraged to make an appointment at the Rectory before going to the hospital.

THE PASTOR'S COLUMN

IF A KINGDOM IS DIVIDED AGAINST ITSELF, THAT KINGDOM CANNOT STAND.

Welcome back to Ordinary Time. This is the 10th Sunday of Ordinary Time with no special remembrance or celebration. That does not mean that it is not an extraordinary day. It is now up to us remember those celebrations, mysteries, and lessons bringing them into the ordinary to make our experiences, our memories, our lives extraordinary.

In the Gospel today we hear Jesus speak about division and unity. He is accused of casting out demons with the power of demons. His response is that a kingdom divided cannot stand. How can he use the power of evil against evil? It doesn't work like that. However what we see before and after this leads us to an even deeper meaning. There is division among Jesus's family, his mother and brothers and sisters. (These terms used for brother and sister have a broader meaning to include cousins and even non blood related close friends).

The division in our own hearts and lives, among our families and our world have one answer. That is Christ. Like his "family" we sometime want to tell Christ what to do and how to be God. However Jesus is a lot better at being God than we are. He reminds us that we are stronger together and that he is the source of that unity. In Christ we are not many people divided by values, skin color, preferences, or place of birth. In Christ we are One. We are one people. We are one family. We are one Body. So let us remember this unity that we are called to as we seek to live extraordinarily.
