BAPTISMS

Baptisms are held at 12 noon on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of the month. Parents must attend a Pre-Jordan class held in the Wright Center at 12 noon on the first Sunday of every other month. Registration for the class is required. In order to arrange for a baptism, the parents must be active members of the parish. To register, please call the rectory office at 610/789-7676 ext. 101. Godparents should be practicing Catholics, confirmed and at least 16 years of age. If not from this parish, sponsors must have a letter of eligibility from their parish stating that they have been actively participating . St. Bernadette Parishioners must be registered and actively participating.

MARRIAGES

We request that couples contemplating marriage call the rectory to make an appointment with the priest. At this initial interview, the date and time of your request will be recorded and you will receive a copy of the Parish Wedding Guidelines.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK/COMMUNION CALLS

A priest will administer Holy Communion to parishioners who are unable to come to Church. If you desire, Eucharistic Ministers can bring Communion each week. Please contact the Rectory to be placed on our Sick List. Parishioners who are to undergo serious surgery at a hospital are encouraged to make an appointment at the Rectory before going to the hospital.

Due to the privacy act, if you are in the hospital and wish to see a priest while you are there, you must register as a Catholic when admitted or make sure a family member does so for you to assure a visit by a priest or Extraordinary Minister of the Eucharist.

THE PASTOR'S COLUMN

TO WHAT SHALL WE COMPARE THE KINGDOM OF GOD ...?

The other day I had a headache. I took some Advil and the headache went away. I was driving and realized I was getting hungry so I stopped at Wawa and got something to eat. I was in a debate with a friend about a point of history so I took out my phone and Googled the facts that I needed. I am going on a trip and realized I needed a few things so I looked them up on Amazon and they were here the next day. I am used to getting what I need (or think I need) fairly quickly.

However this not how the whole world operates, especially God. Today's Gospel centers on the Kingdom of God and how it grows like a plant or tree. In fact it is like the smallest of seeds that grows into a large tree. It does not grow quickly or instantly. It takes time. This sometimes is extremely frustrating to me. I just want God to come fix my problems and change me and especially other people right now. I want to be holier and smarter. I want others to be healthy and have what they need.
