RECTORY OFFICE HOURS

The rectory office hours are Monday through Friday from 9:00am to noon and 1:00pm to 5:00pm. During the summer the rectory will close at 3:00pm on Fridays. Items for the Sunday newsletter must be at the rectory by Monday at noon for publication the following Sunday.

BAPTISMS

Baptisms are held at 12 noon on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of the month. Parents must attend a Pre-Jordan class held in the Wright Center at 12 noon on the first Sunday of every other month. Registration for the class is required. In order to arrange for a baptism, the parents must be active members of the parish. To register, please call the rectory office at 610/789-7676 ext. 101. Godparents should be practicing Catholics, confirmed and at least 16 years of age. If not from this parish, sponsors must have a letter of eligibility from their parish stating that they have been actively participating. St. Bernadette Parishioners must be registered and actively participating.

MARRIAGES

We request that couples contemplating marriage call the rectory to make an appointment with the priest. At this initial interview, the date and time of your request will be recorded and you will receive a copy of the Parish Wedding Guidelines.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK/COMMUNION CALLS

A priest will administer Holy Communion to parishioners who are unable to come to Church. If you desire, Eucharistic Ministers can bring Communion each week. Please contact the Rectory to be placed on our Sick List. Parishioners who are to undergo serious surgery at a hospital are encouraged to make an appointment at the Rectory before going to the hospital.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

SOLEMNITY OF THE **IMMACULATE CONCEPTION**

The Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception, celebrated on Dec. 8, is always a holy day of obligation in the United States. In autumn of 2024, the Holy See directed that since the solemnity falls on a Sunday in Advent this year, it is to be observed with obligation on Monday, Dec. 9.

Due to the shortness of time to instruct the faithful on the directive and to ease their consciences over properly observing this obligation, Archbishop Nelson Pérez has dispensed the faithful from the obligation to attend Mass on Dec. 9 in the parishes, institutions, and religious communities in the Archdiocese of Philadelphia.

Archbishop Pérez encourages the faithful to observe the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception, patroness of the United States, by attending the celebration of Mass as possible, to pray the rosary or engage in another devotion in honor of the Blessed Mother.

THE PASTOR'S COLUMN

THE DAYS ARE COMING, SAYS THE LORD ...

Today, after eating all the Thanksgiving leftovers and putting away all the fall decorations, we are starting on our Advent Journey. Today's gospel reminds us of something very important in our Christian journey. It calls us to be awake and watchful. Therefore, this is a call for us to intensify and strengthen our prayer life. This is because prayer purifies the soul and casts away all fears. It prepares and strengthens us in joyful hope.

How do we begin this preparation? Paul gives us a clue in our second reading when he says: "May he so confirm your hearts in holiness that you may be blameless in the sight of our God...when our Lord Jesus comes with all his saints." Holiness of life in our world today appears to have lost its meaning or perhaps is one concept that sounds so abstract or even relative. In other words, it is believed by many, even Christians, to be unattainable. Yet, it is a necessary condition for seeing and meeting the Lord when he comes because, "without holiness no man can see the Lord".

In spite of the difficulties we face in attaining holiness, this season Paul admonishes us to "conduct ourselves in the way that please God." This is a call to strive for perfection. If it were not possible, Christ would not have demanded it from us. So, this season, let us endeavor to avoid greed, anger, malice, backbiting, gossips, drunkenness, and all sorts of vices. We must prepare and equip ourselves with good virtues like a bride waiting for her groom.

Importantly, prayer provides us the spiritual energy, courage and confidence to stand firm. Therefore, as a family, this Advent offers us the opportunity to unite in prayers as we wait for the Lord. So, rather than engage ourselves only with mundane preparations, let us engage ourselves in intensive prayers. Let us prepare together as a family through prayer.

FIRST ADVENT CANDLE: HOPE "Once in our world, a stable had something in it that was bigger than our whole world." – C.S. Lewis

It is only fitting that the first candle on the Advent wreath represents **Hope** – the first Sunday of Advent not only leads us to anticipate the birth of Christ but celebrate the beginning of a new liturgical season as well. The first candle is **purple**, the primary color of Advent and a color symbolizing royalty. Sometimes called the **"Prophecy Candle,"** the first candle harkens us back to Isaiah's foretelling of the birth of Christ and all of the promises God gave us in the Old Testament that would be fulfilled by the birth of Jesus. This Advent, light the first candle on **Sunday, December 1, 2024.**
